Background

The road sector is going though an unprecedented period of restructuring. Countries are improving management of their road networks, introducing private sector finance, setting up new style road funds and changing the way they set spending priorities and manage their roads. The University of Birmingham with Transit New Zealand offers three linked one-week courses to tackle the various issues with key speakers drawn from around the world.

Sponsorship

Participants are responsible for meeting the costs of participation in the courses. Those seeking financial support for course fees and / or travel expenses should either apply to their employer or request their government to support them under the training component of an ongoing donor loan, credit or grant. The main donors supporting these courses include the World Bank, European Union and the UK Department for International Development (DfID).

Course Recognition

The courses have been developed in collaboration with the World Bank and are recognised as qualifying for the new International Road Federation (IRF) Certificate in Road Management.

Who Should Attend

The three professional development courses are specifically designed for senior road executives, members of roads boards, government officials dealing with the road international donor sector. staff from organisations, and consultants working on the road sector. The courses provide opportunity to interact with senior road managers from other countries, staff from donor organisations, members of consulting firms and staff involved in restructuring road management and finance. Examples presented in the past have included emerging good practice from France, Ghana, Latvia, Namibia, New Zealand, Romania, South Africa, Sweden, UK, USA and Zambia. Participants can choose to attend 1,2 or all 3 courses.

Accommodation and Lecture Facilities

The University of Birmingham will host the courses. Special dinners are arranged at some of Birmingham's most vibrant restaurants and there are optional visits to places of interest during participant's free time. The programme includes full board en-suite accommodation to the standard of a good quality hotel. Participants also have selective access to University facilities, including the Library, the sports complex and other leisure facilities.
