

OARS Statuts

Observatoire Africain de la Sécurité Routière

Article 1

Création

Conformément à la décision n°...du comité technique spécialisé de l'Union Africaine en charge des Transports, des Infrastructures, de l'Energie et du Tourisme en mars 2017 (Lomé) de mettre en place des indicateurs de sécurité routière, dans la lignée de la Charte Africaine de la Sécurité Routière signée par les chefs d'État et du plan d'action africain de sécurité routière défini à l'occasion de la Décennie d'Action des Nations Unies, le présent document expose la gouvernance et le fonctionnement de l'Observatoire Africain de la Sécurité routière, ci-après dénommé OASR.

Article 2

Vision

L'OASR est la plate-forme d'échange du continent africain concernant les politiques, pratiques et données de sécurité routière pour protéger les vies humaines sur les routes d'Afrique.

Article 3

Mission

L'OASR a pour mission de développer la coopération internationale et au sein du continent africain ainsi que de générer une solide base de données et des analyses afin d'avoir un impact positif sur les politiques publiques concernant la sécurité routière, influencer et évaluer techniquement les acteurs principaux responsables de la sécurité routière dans les Pays Africains Membres (PAM), pour réduire considérablement les accidents de la circulation routière et leurs conséquences.

ARSO ByLaws

African Road Safety Observatory

Article 1 Creation

Pursuant to the 2017 decision on road safety indicators by the African Union Specialized Technical Committee (STC) on Transport, Transcontinental and Interregional Infrastructures, Energy and Tourism, the African Road Safety Charter agreed by Heads of States, and the African Road Safety Action Plan on the UN Decade of Action, this document sets out the governance and functioning of the African Road Safety Observatory (ARSO).

Article 2

Visio

ARSO is the regional forum on road safety data, policies and practices to ensure the protection of human life on the roads of Africa.

Article 3

Mission

The mission of ARSO is to foster international and continental cooperation in Africa and to generate robust road safety data and analysis to positively impact on public policies for road safety, influence and technically assess the main actors responsible for road safety in African Member Countries (AMCs), in order to substantially reduce road traffic crashes, and their consequences.

Article 4

Objectives

The objectives of ARSO are to:

- a) Collect, manage and analyse road crash data
- Provide technical assistance for AMCs on data collection systems, standards and norms
- Foster the establishment of national road safety observatories
- Share technical material, software and necessary tools for collecting and analysing road safety data
- Provide capacity building on technical issues and guidelines related to road safety
- Facilitate twinning arrangements between countries striving to enhance their road crash data and countries with good crash data

MARRAKECH DECLARATION

1st African Road Safety Forum 13th – 15th November 2018 Marrakech

Declaration

We African Ministers who participated to the 1st African Road Safety forum held in Marrakech from 13th to 15th of November 2018, committed to the following:

Considering the facts:

With only 2.3 percent of the world's vehicles, the lowest level of motorization globally, Africa has the highest road traffic fatality rates in the world: 26.6 per 100,000 population. The average road traffic mortality across the OECD countries is 8 deaths per 100,000. This translates to 650 deaths per day, half which are pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists. As a result, road crashes sap Africa's youth and working age population and also rob the Continent of precious resources it could use for growth and development, which instead go to treating and caring for the consequences of crashes. Between 1990 and 2013, there has been an 89 percent increase in the number of road injury deaths, and road trauma in Africa is expected to worsen further, with fatalities per capita projected to double by 2030 from 2015 figures.

Ministers agreed that it was crucial that Africa halts and reverses these trends. Countries must implement effective road safety policies and strategies now, to mitigate the worsening epidemic of road fatalities and serious injuries.

Ministers committed to the following actions to be implemented during the calendar year 2019:

- Review and eventually, update the legislative and regulatory framework of the transport sector, to ensure comprehensive road safety provisions are included;
- Develop sound policies and effective strategies, backed up with appropriate action plans;
- Create lead agencies to manage road safety (for countries that have not yet done so):
- · Allocate adequate funding to road safety activities.
- Promote the adoption of regulations for importation of cleaner, safer and more
 efficient vehicles, including used vehicles.
- Encourage countries to prioritize the development of their civil registration and vital statistics system with the involvement of all stakeholders and international partners
- Encourage countries to promote partnership with civil society as a key player in the implementation of national road safety strategy.

OTHER DUTIES ACCOMPLISHED

- Several African countries joined the 2020 ESRA data collection on attitudes, perception and self-reported behaviors. Several of the data elements in this survey belong to safety performance indicators.
- The countries are: Benin, Cameroon, Cote dÍvorie, Egypt, Ghana, Kenya, Morocco, Nigeria, South Africa, Tunisia, Uganda, and Zambia. Besides country-specific reports, there is a joint report entitled "Road Safety Culture in Africa. Results from the ESRA2 survey in 12 African Countries" now available at the ARSO website;
- During 2020, two online NDCs meetings were held (August 21 and November 18-20) to prepare the first ever data submission on a broad array of road safety data elements
- Several reports (at least 5, check) have been produced to date


