
















Line 9 Sud runs from the airport to Fira Gran Via, and into the city of Barcelona. It connects with three other major Metro lines, so nearly every area of city has a simpler way to get to Fira Gran Via. The main station in the venue is called Fira.

Coming from Barcelona Airport?

From Terminal 1: walk about 700m to the Metro station at Terminal 1 station and take Line 9 Sud to Zona Universitària for 9 stops. Exit at Fira station. From Terminal 2: enter the Metro station at Terminal 2 station and take Line 9 Sud to Zona Universitària for 8 stops. Exit at Fira station.

Coming from Barcelona-Sants?

Take the Metro line 5 to Cornellà Centre for 3 stops and exit at Collblanc station. Then take the Metro line 9 Sud for 4 stops and exit at Fira station.
















Metro lines: 9 (direct from Fira of Barcelona and UITP Summit) and 3 (green color) Other options: Tramway, bus and taxi.
