Session on Corridor Performance Monitoring, chaired by Dominique Njinkeu

The two main objectives of the session are:

- To take stock of the monitoring initiatives along the various corridors, compile the available core indicators, and define an action plan for completing the monitoring framework
- And more importantly, to define an action plan to utilize the diagnosis and indicators to address the bottlenecks which have been identified.

The session will be concluded by the adoption of a joint action plan.

Session on the future of SSATP Regional Integration Component:

The content of the regional integration cluster has been discussed during the REC TCC meetings in March and October 2012, before being reviewed by the SSATP AGM in December 2012. The final version, circulated prior to the meeting, will include consolidated comments received before the meeting. A stronger coordination of activities would imply a strong platform for exchange among the regional integration community that constitutes the REC TCC.

Session on dissemination and feedback to present recent SSATP knowledge products.

### **Africa Road Transport Forum 2013:**

The Forum will discuss the road transport industry, and border crossing conditions. Those two topics have been removed from the REC TCC Agenda, as the Forum will benefit from a wider audience.
