Programme

The World Bank, UNEP, UN-Habitat, and the Government of Kenya, with funding from the SSATP (Africa Transport Policy Programme) have formed a partnership to launch the **ASTF.**

The ASTF is a platform for African stakeholders to learn, share, collectively commit and self-initiate an action framework to address congestion, reduce air pollution, climate emissions, and improve road safety, health and access. The goal of the Forum will be to integrate sustainable transport into the region's development and planning processes and increase the amount of funding going to sustainable transport programs in Africa.

The first activity of the ASTF will be to hold the 1st Ministerial and Experts Conference on Sustainable Transport, Tuesday 28th – Thursday 30th October 2014in Nairobi and develop a Sustainable Transport Action Framework for Africa.

The goals of the 1st Ministerial and Experts Conference are:

- Develop the framework of the ASTF (what is it, how will it work, what are the priorities)
- Share Sustainable Transport best practice from Africa and beyond
- Develop a Sustainable Transport Action Framework
