OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP

- 1. Promote increased awareness of rural travel and transport (RTT) issues in Sub-Saharan African (SSA) Countries.
- 2. Assist countries in SSA develop policies and strategies to:
- Improve the planning, financing, provisioning and maintenance of rural transport infrastructure (RTI)
- Improve rural transport services and mobility through adoption of appropriate transport technologies to facilitate people and goods movement; and
- Promote gender equality in access to mobility
- 3. Disseminate 'good practice' examples within SSA



OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP: Where are we (1)

Promote increased awareness of rural travel and transport (RTT) issues in Sub-Saharan African (SSA) Countries.

- Growth in number of participating countries:
- 1997 4; 1998 8; 1999 14; 2000 19
- Recognition of need to increase number of RTT projects
- Acceptance of role of RTT in poverty alleviation



OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP: Where are we (2)

Assist SSA countries develop national rural transport policies and strategies.

• Projected Progression of Existing Participating Countries

	2000	2001	2002	2003
Stage 1	9	2	-	-
Stage 2	5	11	3	-
Stage 3	2	6	16	19
Total	16	19	19	19

Existing number of participants about half of SSA countries.



OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP:

Where are we? (3)

Increased share of SSATP program resources, with proposed 3-year Program costs distributed as follows:

	Share of Total (%)
RTTP	33
Trade and Transport	21
Urban Mobility	16
RMI	18
Railway Restructuring	2
Thematic Bridging	1
General Administration	8

However, Interim CY2001 RTTP budget only about 64% of need.



OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP: Where are we? (4)

Emerging Policies Focus on Adoption of Methods and Approaches for:

- Improving the planning, financing, provisioning and maintenance of rural transport infrastructure (RTI)
- Improving rural transport services and mobility through adoption of appropriate transport technologies to facilitate people and goods movement; and
- Promoting gender equality in access to mobility
- Use as tool for poverty alleviation
- Promoting the awareness of rural travel and transport issues.

Elaboration of physical interventions to give effect to policy. Supported by thematic work.



OBJECTIVES OF THE RTTP: Where are we? (5)

Disseminating 'good practice' examples within SSA:

- Not many but increasing.
- Need to put in place effective framework for documentation and dissemination of emerging experiences.



ADDRESSING SOME EMERGING ISSUES: The Issues Restated

- 1. Policy development and implementation by relatively weak institutions.
- 2. Level of understanding of and priority given to RTT still low.
- 3. Road Fund getting fair share for RTI and using well.
- 4. Fragmentation of stakeholders and interventions.
- 5. Promoting use of labor intensive work methods.
- 6. Monitoring and evaluation of impacts of RTT interventions.
- 7. Improving rural transport services and use of IMTs.
- 8. Mobilizing more resources for RTT interventions.



ADDRESSING EMERGING ISSUES: Situational Report?

- 1. Policy development and implementation by relatively weak institutions. **Still relevant, especially with implementation.**
- 2. Level of understanding of, and priority given to RTT still low. **Increasing, but new dimensions emerging.**
- 1. Road Fund getting fair share for RTI and using well. Need recognized but what is 'good practice'?
- 1. Fragmentation of stakeholders and interventions. Still relevant.
- 2. Promoting use of labor intensive work methods. **Demand increasing.**
- 3. Monitoring and evaluation of impacts of RTT interventions. **Need recognized but baseline data needed.**
- 4. Improving rural transport services and use of IMTs. Need accepted but what is 'good practice' and how to scale up?
- Mobilizing more resources for RTT interventions. PRSP/HIPC provide opportunities.



THE RTTP: A Program at a Crossroad


- 1. Maturing but how strong are the foundations?
- 2. Increasing Program resources but will it be enough to meet demand?
- 3. Increasing RTT projects, but what are implications for implementation capacity at Program and country levels?
- 4. How to make multi-sector approach work effectively, especially at country level.
- 5. Requirements of decentralization, for RTTP and participating countries?
- 6. Capturing and disseminating 'good practice'.
- 7. Increasing regional involvement and ownership.



CONSOLIDATING THE GAINS: The Key Tasks

- 1. Ensure establishment of RTTP implementation framework at country level, and monitor and evaluate its performance.
- 2. Implement guidelines for country participation in RTTP.
- 3. Increase focus on knowledge generation and management.
- 4. Facilitate development of regional and country level capacity.







CONSOLIDATING THE GAINS: Needed Focus for RTTP

- Continuing with promotion/facilitation of development and implementation of good RTT policies and strategies and their safeguarding.
- Increasingly, provision of advisory, knowledge dissemination and capacity building services to countries in SSA.

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- Continuing assistance to SSA countries on policy and strategy development and implementation but less intensive than now.
- Thematic work to generate knowledge and capture lessons of experience.
- · Dissemination and capacity building activities.
- Creating an effective network of rural transport practitioners in SSA with RTTP Coordinators at the core.



CONSOLIDATING THE GAINS: Promoting Regional Networking

Facilitate Creation of African Rural Transport Network (ARTNET).
