Regional Integration and Transport Recommendations (1)

Legal Harmonization

- Implement agreed regional conventions for Transport services, Transit and Transport Security
- Update national legislation accordingly
- Complete harmonization of standards and procedures



- Sets the stage for effective economic use of resources along regional corridors
- Stimulates cross-border trade and ancillary activities

Regional Integration and Transport Recommendations (2)

Resources Allocation

- Focus investments on infrastructure missing links to strengthen regional networks
- Support private providers of transport services through streamlined regulations, lower taxation on imported new commercial vehicles, and enhanced credit terms

- Improves road safety and supply of reliable transport services,
- Enhances market access for local producers and generates revenues and/or new jobs

Regional Integration and Transport Recommendations (3)

Coordination/Capacity Building

- Empower civil society, including women's associations, to help set up effective public-private corridor institutions to monitor operations, sustain HIV-AIDS prevention and promote road safety
- Liaise with other ministries responsible for traffic administration and control to remove non-physical barriers to trade

- Amplifies impact of road safety and HIV prevention policies
- Fosters trade growth throughout regional corridors, furthering market integration and jobs generation
