Road Network Management

- Performance Assessment Model (PAM) of road networks - Workshop held in Nairobi in November 2005
- 2) Road Management Tools Study on going

Road Fund Enhancement

- Support to ARMFA Annual meetings held in Arusha (November 05: 22 members out of 24 active Road Funds in SSA), SSATP/ARMFA partnership underway, emphasis on performance indicators
- 2) RF Legislation data base on-going revision of CD-ROM prepared and distributed though ARMFA (November 04)
- 3) Legal/Institutional/Performance review (Mozambique-Tanzania- Zambia and Ivory Cost)

Road Management Improvement

- 1) Support to AGEPAR: Annual meetings held in Niamey in May 05, one seminar on Performance-Based contracts in N'Djamena (February 05), SSATP/AGEPAR partnership underway, activity focused on performance—based maintenance standard documents and capacity building.
- 2) RAs Legislation data base CD-ROM prepared and distributed though AGEPAR (May 05) and reviewed

- SSATP/RMF new staff provided direct support to countries undertaking/enhancing road sector reforms through preparation of ToR/study and legislation review/advice...

Stay the course toward Second Generation Road Funds (1)

- Build consensus to better understand and implement the road sector reforms in line with Second Generation Road Funds' principles
- Adjust annually road user charges until they meet road maintenance needs
- Diversify as necessary road user charges



Sustain and secure road maintenance financing through appropriate legislation

Stay the course toward Second Generation Road Funds (2)

- Improve communication with road users and political decision-makers through media
- Ensure transparency in the management of road fund resources
- Strengthen the capacity of Road Fund Boards' members
- Identify performance and impact indicators of Road Funds



Accelerate implementation of efficient road management (1)

- Develop road sector policy in line with the PRSP
- Establish autonomous Road Agencies and give more autonomy to existing ones
- Clarify roles and responsibilities of Ministries, Road Boards, Road Funds, Road Agencies



Accelerate implementation of more efficient road management (2)

- Define appropriate models and indicators to assess the performance of road networks and road agencies
- Strengthen inter-regional coordination between sector associations



Accelerate implementation of more efficient road management (3)

 Strengthen management and implementation capacity of road agencies

 Ensure that road planning and programming respond to the users' needs, especially of women and children



Provide enabling environment to enhance private sector participation in road management

- Provide training facilities for small scale contractors
- Enhance Public Private Partnership (PPP) e.g.
 Performance-based contracts
- Improve access to financial facilities
- Ensure timely payments to contractors



Develop and implement appropriate rural transport strategies

- Allocate sufficient funding to rural roads
- Use rural road funding cost-effectively
- Enhance intermediate means of transport services
- Empower women



ATS Work Plan 2005 - Targets

The ATS 2005 Work Plan had the following subthemes:

- Urban Transport
 - Urban public transport organization and regulation in large cities
 - Poverty and Urban Mobility
 - Non Motorized Means of Transport (NMT) guidelines
- Rural Transport
 - Rural Transport Services
 - Audit of past Intermediate Means of Transport (IMT) promotion efforts
 - RTTP follow-on activities

- Urban Transport
 - "Large Cities Study"
 - A study looking at the institutional, financial, operational and regulatory environment in four cities (Dakar, Douala, Kampala and Nairobi) has been carried out
 - Follow up workshops were held in all the four cities to discuss the results
 - The result of the study and the workshops will feed into the planned workshop on urban transport tomorrow



- Urban transport
 - Poverty and Urban Mobility
 - The study which was carried out in 2004 can be found on the SSATP web site
 - Non motorized transport NMT) Guidelines
 - These have been published as a SSATP publication both in English and French
 - Urban Transport Data Base
 - Collection of base line data on-going
 - Creation of Urban Transport Forum???



- Rural Transport
 - Rural Transport Services Study in four countries (Cameroon, Burkina Faso, Tanzania and Zambia) has been carried out
 - Looking at medium distance transport (5-200km)
 - Developing a low-cost, rapid methodology for RTS assessment
 - Results of the study will be presented at a Rural Transport workshop tomorrow



- Audit of past IMT (Intermediate Means of Transport) Promotion efforts
 - Award of contract in September 2005
 - Intermediate results of study available
 - Will feed into the rural transport workshop tomorrow
- Creation of Rural Transport Association
 - Draft constitution drafted
 - Still needs to be discussed and adopted

- Distill policy lessons from completed and ongoing work
- Ensure inclusion of these lessons in the Poverty and Transport policy development process
- Define the way forward in the LTDP process and the 2006 work program
