

Magnitude of Problem Global

- 1.2 million deaths on the roads annually
- 30 50 million injuries
- 11th leading cause of death
- 85% of all fatalities, and 96% of children, in low and middle-income countries
- Traffic accidents already cost the Southern Hemisphere almost as much as all the aid it receives

Magnitude of Problem Africa

- Estimated annual crash cost: 1-2% of GNP or 3.7 US\$ billion
- Injured pedestrians and passengers in mass transportation are the main issues in Africa
- WHO African Region had the highest mortality rate in 2002, at 28.3 per 100 000 population
- 4% of vehicles, 10% of death globally

Magnitude of Problem Projected

- By 2020 deaths forecast to rise 65% - worldwide
- The increase in low and middle income countries is forecast to be 80%
- The same model predicts a 27% reduction in high income countries

Capacity

- Problem Statement
 - Inadequate allocation of financial resources for RS
 - Weak Institutional Framework
 - Inadequate Human Resource
 - Inadequate Data
- Proposed Interventions
 - Governments to prioritize funding for RS
 - Road Funds, Private-Public Partnerships, Donors
 - Governments to Set Up Lead Road Safety Agency
 - Effective Coordination
 - Training For Road Safety Practitioners
 - Set Up RS Data System

Speed Management

- Problem Statement
 - Speed is a major accident contributing factor
 - Pedestrians, Public Transport Casualties, etc
- Proposed Interventions
 - Implement Speed Management Strategy
 - Legislation, Behavioral Change, Education, Enforcement, Engineering

- Problem Statement
 - Insufficient Regulations
 - Inadequate Enforcement of
 - Traffic Regulations, Vehicle Standards, Driver Licensing
- Proposed Interventions
 - Review & Update Codes & Regulations
 - Support for Enforcement Agencies
 - Training, equipment...

Pedestrian Safety

- Problem Statement
 - About 40% 60% Pedestrian Fatalities
 - High Proportion of Children, women, Physically Challenged & Poor
- Proposed Interventions
 - Speed Management
 - Improved visibility
 - Improved Pedestrian Facilities

SSATP Priority Recommendations

- Develop Broad African RS Policy Framework
 - Institutions, Resources, Data Systems, etc
- Develop & Disseminate Good Practice Materials
 - Speed Management, Pedestrian Safety
- Regional & Sub-Regional Harmonization of Standards & Regulations
- Assist with implementation of action plans from pilot countries
- Support RS Advocacy in Member Countries
