Remarks by the Government Secretary and Master of Ceremony, Mr. Tlohang Sekhamane

We are gathered here this morning for the official opening of the Sub-Saharan African Transport Program Ministerial Advisory Group. This meeting is an integral part of the 2006 Maseru SSATP Annual General Meeting and Conference.

The Ministerial Advisory Group Meeting has been preceded by a meeting of Conference Delegates who met over the last seven days in their various thematic groups to deliberate upon a wide array of transport policy issues with the objective of anchoring transport issues in poverty reduction strategies. They will strategize on the way forward particularly with respect to the achievement of the lofty goats they set for the Sub-Saharan transport sector in the Bamako Declaration when the met in Mali last year. It is therefore befitting that the Honorable Mr. Lesao Lehohla, Deputy Prime Minister and Acting Prime Minister has been invited to officially open this important meeting of Ministers.
