Statement by the Honorable Deputy Minister of Transport of Zanzibar, Mr. Machano Said, MP

It has actively participated in SSATP activities including actively participating in making decisions in SSATP meetings and implementing them throughout its membership period. We have followed up on all issues which have been decided upon by SSATP. These include but not limited to the following:

- (i) Having in place a Road Funds in both Tanzania Mainland and Zanzibar,
- (ii) Having in place Road Agency (TANROADS),
- (iii) We have completed the PRTSR process,
- (iv) Have in place a National Transport Policy and associated Implementation Strategies,
- (v) We are finalizing a transport sector wide program called Transport Sector Investment Program (TSIP),
- (vi) We have completed the first two cycles of data collection under the PMI thematic group,

- (vii) Have in place a Draft National Road Safety Policy and working on Implementation Strategy.
- (viii) Have in place mechanisms for consultation with stakeholders.

We wish to be continued active and committed members of SSATP.

I wish you all good deliberations that will lead to a better transport systems n Sub Saharan Africa region leading to poverty reduction and hence bringing about development.
