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



SaferAfrica concept (1)


The underpinning concept of SaferAfrica is the Safe System approach, which is considered an integral part of all road safety and traffic management activities

Review RSM in selected African countries Analyse efficacy of current RSM systems in these countries

Develop improvement strategies for RSM, specifically the institutional management framework

Assess and propose improvements for legislative and organizational reforms in order to improve RSM

Capacity Building & Training

Identify training needs and develop capacity building programs focused on road safety in African countries

Provide modules and tools for efficient training (e.g. train-the-trainers approach)

Based on existing EU training courses (e.g. Delft Road Safety Courses, CEMAC road safety week)

All results (e.g. training modules, e-learning

Sharing of good practices

Analyse good road safety practices realized at country, corridor and regional levels in Africa Compare with those of other countries Provide recommendations for their adaptation in other countries

A number of road safety developments exist:

- National road safety council: Burundi, Burkina
 Faso, Guinea, Ethiopia, Lesotho, Cote d'Ivoire
- Road safety strategy: Malawi, Zambia, South
